Themes of the Oral and Poster Presentation:

Focus on highlighting successful models of integration of vocational education in school through internships and apprenticeship.

Focus on importance of personalized guidance and continuous support for ensuring well informed career decisions by the individuals

4. Leveraging technology and Digital platforms for Skill development

Focus on creating and using digital tools and platforms to expand access to skilling, enabling personalised, scalable, and technology-driven learning solutions.

5. Assessment and Certification frameworks in Skill/Vocational Education

Focus on developing standardised and industry-relevant certification systems, ensuring recognition, mobility, and lifelong learning opportunities.

6. Strengthening School-Industry partnerships

Focus on nurturing an ecosystem promoting entrepreneurial skills and innovation-driven mindsets at the school level through mentorship, funding, and real-time skill development.

7. Future skills, Green Jobs and Digital Economy requirements for a sustainable future

Focus on aligning skilling initiatives with sustainability and climate goals and preparing workforce for green jobs.

- Word limit is 250 words (excluding title, keywords, reference/s)
- Use these headings: Introduction, Approach/Method, Findings, Conclusion or Implications
- Mention the credentials of the author/s on the first page of the abstract, including Name, Designation, Organisation, Address, Mobile No., Email
- Word limit for full paper is 2000-2500 words
- Content should be original and free from plagiarism

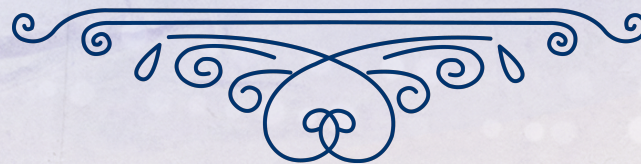
