## **Notification**

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Tobacco is the foremost cause of preventable death and disease in the world today. India is the second largest consumer of tobacco products in the world. National Family Health Survey – 3, 2006 indicates an increasing prevalence of tobacco consumption in India, with 57% male and 10.9% females reportedly consuming tobacco in some form. Global Youth Tobacco Survey (GYTS), 2006 also indicates that approx. 14% children in the age group of 13-15 years are consuming tobacco in some form and that the age of initiation into tobacco has come down. The World Health Organization attributes over four million deaths a year to tobacco. This figure is expected to rise to 10 million deaths a year by 2030, with 70% of these deaths occurring in developing countries.

CBSE strongly feels that students should abstain themselves from this deadly habit and has issued **circular no. 58** *'Guidelines on Protection from Exposure to Tobacco Smoke'* dated November 20, 2009. As an extension to the above mentioned circular CBSE now issues an Anti-Tobacco pledge.

The schools are advised to let students in the age group of 12-16 pledge it in the special 'Anti-Tobacco' assembly.
