National AI Literacy Campaign

The Government of India, through the IndiaAI Mission under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), has launched YUVA AI for All, a foundational AI literacy course aimed at building a basic understanding of Artificial Intelligence among students and youth across the country.

The YUVA AI for All course has been designed as a free, accessible, and inclusive learning pathway, introducing learners irrespective of age, gender, or background to the fundamentals of Artificial Intelligence and its real-world applications, thereby supporting the national objective of democratising AI knowledge.

MeitY has proposed to launch a National AI Literacy Campaign, anchored on National Youth Day, 12 January 2026, with the objective of enabling large-scale participation and course completions nationwide. The campaign seeks to mobilise lakhs of learners to certify on the YUVA AI for All-Foundational AI Course (AI 101) and to create a coordinated, time-bound national moment of collective AI learning. The course is available on iGOT Karmayogi, DIKSHA, FutureSkills Prime and other major edtech platforms.

A Concept Note, outlining the objectives, framework, and anticipated outcomes of the campaign, is enclosed as Annexure I.

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YUVA AI for All: National AI Literacy Campaign

Proposed Launch Date: 12 January (National Youth Day)

Concept Note

The YUVA AI for All National AI Literacy Campaign is a national AI literacy initiative of the Government of India led by the IndiaAI Mission under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) to build foundational Artificial Intelligence (AI) awareness among students and youth across the country. Anchored on National Youth Day (12) January, the campaign aims to mobilise lakhs of learners to complete a short, self-paced Foundational AI course (AI 101) and create a nationwide moment of collective AI learning.

The initiative aligns with the Government's vision of Viksit Bharat, the expansion of Digital Public Infrastructure, and India's commitment to inclusive, responsible, and democratic adoption of AI. By leveraging existing youth, school education, and digital learning ecosystems, the campaign seeks to mainstream AI literacy as a core life skill for India's future workforce and citizens.

B. Policy Context and Rationale

Artificial Intelligence is increasingly shaping economic growth, public service delivery, and societal interactions. As India positions itself as a global leader in AI for public good, it is critical that citizens particularly young people possess a baseline understanding of what AI is, how it works, where it is used, and how it should be deployed responsibly.

The YUVA AI for All course has been designed as an inclusive entry point to AI learning, requiring no prior technical background. A national campaign approach is proposed to ensure scale, equity, and visibility, while reinforcing inter-ministerial coordination and Centre-State collaboration on AI literacy.

C. The YUVA AI for All Course

- Nature: Foundational AI 101/AI literacy course
- Duration: Approximately 4.5 hours, self-paced
- Pedagogy: Modular lessons with short assessments
- Curriculum Covered: What is Artificial Intelligence, The Technology behind Artificial Intelligence, Using Artificial Intelligence to Learn, Create, think and plan, Artificial Intelligence Ethics and The Future of Artificial Intelligence
- Certification: Government-authorised certificate (IndiaAI Mission & MeitY)
- Target Groups:
 - School students (secondary and senior secondary)
 - Youth and first-time learners
 - Teachers, government officials, and citizens seeking AI awareness

E. National Youth Day as the Campaign Anchor

The campaign will be anchored on 12 January (National Youth Day), commemorating Swami Vivekananda's birth anniversary. The day provides a powerful national platform to inspire youth participation, align AI literacy with nation-building, and achieve a record number of course completions within a single day.

F. Objectives

- Achieve large-scale adoption and completion of the YUVA AI for All course
- Mainstream AI literacy as a foundational skill for youth and students
- Strengthen inter-ministerial and Centre-State collaboration on AI education
- Promote responsible, inclusive, and ethical understanding of AI

G. Institutional Framework and Partnerships

H. Expected Outcomes

- Significant increase in AI awareness among students and youth

- Foundation for long-term integration of AI literacy in education and skilling





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I. Monitoring, Measurement and Digital Dashboard

To ensure transparency, accountability, and real-time monitoring, the YUVA AI for All campaign will be supported through a centralised digital dashboard coordinated by the IndiaAI Mission in collaboration with participating platforms.

Key features of the monitoring framework include:

- Real-time aggregation of enrolments and course completions across platforms
- State-wise and district-wise completion data
- Population-normalised indicators (completions per 1,000 population)
- Zone-wise rankings (North, South, East, West, North-East)
- Gender and age-band analytics where available

The dashboard will support evidence-based decision-making, enable mid-course corrections during the campaign, and form the basis for post-campaign recognition of States and districts.

J. Conclusion and Way Forward

The YUVA AI for All National AI Literacy Campaign represents a significant step towards democratising access to Artificial Intelligence knowledge and preparing India's youth for the opportunities and responsibilities of an AI-driven future. Anchored on National Youth Day and leveraging India's robust digital learning and youth engagement ecosystems, the initiative aims to transform AI literacy from a niche technical subject into a shared national competency.

The campaign is envisioned not merely as a one-day learning milestone, but as the foundation of a sustained, scalable, and inclusive AI literacy movement. Through coordinated action across ministries, States, educational institutions, industry, and digital platforms, YUVA AI for All will contribute meaningfully to India's vision of Viksit Bharat empowering informed citizens, nurturing responsible innovation, and strengthening India's leadership in AI for public good.



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
